School Improvements

SIAMS Inspection

We have finally received the report from our SIAMS inspection held under the new, much more rigorous framework towards the end of last term. Once again, many thanks to all of the pupils, volunteers, parents, Governors, Reverend Jackson and staff who gave up their time to speak to the inspector, giving their honest opinions of the school. It will be published on the website next week. We received a grading of Good with some of the following comments:
